In December, he passed away, and I am so glad I got to know him before he said his final goodbye.

Not long after that, on a snowy day, a different neighbor invited me and another neighbor over for salad and a baked potato. He had provided various toppings for the potato and the salad. We laughed and joked and had a grand ole time. And even though it was a simple gesture, it made a very big impression on me.

We are blessed to live in a fairly safe community, so it's not taking much of a chance to take a chance to shake a hand, make friend like the Staple singers suggest or reach out and touch somebody's hand, as Diana Ross encourages us to do. Some of us are already going about checking on others, but we can all make a point to do something to show we care about our neighbors. Life should have taught us, by now, we reap what we sow.

Are we almost finished with the heat? By Sheila

This has been a hot summer in Towngate and not sure if we are finished with the heat yet. Our yards are showing some stress! The water bill for our neighborhood is a high cost with Towngate sprinklers running twice a week for the month of August and September, some personal care is needed to keep a green yard. Look at your lawn and answer a question. Are your sprinklers working? Feel the grass on Thursday and Sunday morning and they should be wet. If not wet to the touch, report to the landscape board member, Sheila Raines 214-274-6412 or Town Hall 972-840-1680 The best yards are the ones that homeowners give their yard an extra watering during the week. We are entering the fall season and having a healthy yard now prepares for winter temperatures and spring growth. Most years, Towngate fertilizes a preemergence type of fertilizer in March when it starts to get warm and the rains have begun. Fertilizing your yard three times a year, March, July, and October, encourages healthy growth along with the extra watering. To be honest if you water extra, a healthy yard will grow and choke out the weeds. Best results from using fertilizer is to use Scott Turf Builder Southern Lawns.

Our lawn service is just that, a mow your yard and trim, and shape your bushes. The big job of raking up leaves as they fall is also in our landscape contract. Towngate does not do personal work in the yards. A little time working in your yard, extra watering once a week and fertilizing will surprise you with the results. The flower beds are yours to express your creativity.

The city of Garland picks up our trash between 7am-7pm every Thursday. We are fortunate enough to have bulk pickup every Thursday as well, however, they will not pick up items if there are trash bins, utility meters or vehicles nearby or obstructing their access. Being aware of where you put these items helps ensure that they can be picked up in a timely manner as to not obstruct driveways, alleyways or over time become a fire hazard.

Recycle pick up also happens on Thursdays but only on every other Thursday and the schedule is posted on the front page. It needs to be on concrete and not on grass.

I hope everyone finds this information useful and maybe with everyone doing their part to follow the schedule provided, our alleys and the neighborhood can continue to be beautiful as ever.
